Protest and Disciplinary Committee Coordinators Report

Some statistics from the season:

- ✓ 86 cautions 20 more than in 2018
- ✓ 12 Send-offs 4 more than in 2018
- ✓ The best-behaved divisions were U11, U12 and U17 with zero cautions or send offs
- ✓ The least behaved divisions were AA2 accounting for 17% of cautions and AA1 accounting for 16% of cautions overwhelmingly for unsporting behaviour.
- ✓ Dissent accounted for 22% (15% in 2018) of cautions and temporary dismissals were actioned on 17 occasions during the season.
- ✓ All Age divisions accounted for 79% of cautions.
- ✓ Over 30 divisions accounted for 9% of cautions
- ✓ Junior divisions accounted for 12% of cautions

Offence Code Occurrences

Reported referee abuse was not as much an issue this year as in earlier years but it did raise its ugly head on a few occasions. Treasurer's Report

Thank you to Chris Matthews our Treasurer and Fiona Richards for her overall account keeping for NWSWF this season.

Our financials were audited by V.A Duselis & Co Chartered Accountants, 263 Old Northern Rd, Castle Hill NSW 2154 November 2019.

Revenue has increased from last year by 4.5% mainly from increased Fees and Insurance Income and new revenue generated from Holiday camps.

Expenses for the year were consistent with the previous year. Player Insurance expenses increased by 7%

As a result, the Loss before Income Tax has reduced from almost \$90000 in 2018 to \$30000 this year.

In line with the net loss, the cash balance reduced by \$30000 over the year but, still remains at a healthy \$225000.

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Competition Management Report

As the North West Sydney Women's Football Association prepares to combine with the Gladesville-Hornsby Football Association we are pleased to report that women's football continues to grow. In the 2019 season the number of competitive teams in the NWSWF increased by 5% to 129 and the number of MiniRoos teams increased by 8% to 103.

More than 85% of competitive teams were in a grade that suited their ability. This is a better outcome than 2018's approximately 80%. All senior and most junior teams were graded within their age group. Half of the junior age groups only had enough teams to form one division. Unfortunately, there were still too many double-digit scores this season. As the number players continues to grow these score-lines should become fewer and further between. We know that the new North West Sydney Football Association will endeavour to enact policies that will continue to increase the numbers of girls and women who want to play football, leading to more grading options and less skill mismatches.

The 2019 NWSWF Grand Final day was once again a rousing success. Thank you to all who helped make this day memorable.

Finally, we would like to express our appreciation for all those who have helped make the NWSWF a success over the last 38 years: Those who had the vision to form a women's association in 1981. The board members, committee members, delegates, and clubs who have kept it going year on year and have helped bring us into the new combined association. The thousands of managers and coaches who helped get players on the park week to week. You have enabled tens of thousands of girls and women to enjoy the greatest sport in the world. You should be proud of the work you have done.

And to the players in the NWSWF, thank you for competing in our little sport. You are the reason we work behind the scenes. We trust you will continue to enjoy your football with the North West Sydney Football Association.

MiniRoo's Coordinator's Report

2019 - the last season of the independent North West Sydney Women's Football - has been another highly successful season for girls MiniRoo's football.

Numbers continued to grow this season across all MiniRoo age groups - U6 to U11s - as the size of the MiniRoo program continues to reach record levels each year.

The best achievement this year was continued development, by the association, of the sorting or classifying of teams according to their competitive level. It has been long recognised that significant mis- matches in competitive standard on the field is one of the greatest deterrents for growing the number of players in the game.

Players on the winning side of lop -sided games are deprived of the necessary competitiveness that engages them and drives them to further improvement while players on continuously losing sides in subsequent seasons.

In recent seasons the Association has been better able to monitor match performance and adjust draws accordingly throughout the season. This year we went able one step further and developed a pilot scheme to classify and rank teams, allowing us to put teams into competitive classifications and similar team groupings.

As a general reaction I believe this was successful and, when combined with other mechanisms we now have in place for match monitoring and performance I belief we have moved to a system that is showing the positive benefits of more equitable and suitable team groupings based on ability and experience.

The other hugely positive factor that NWSWF has achieved for the MiniRoo's is in giving all MiniRoo's teams participation in Grand Final Day - both in a full round of MiniRoo's games and a full Association presentation to all MiniRoo's players - all running alongside the Grand Finals for the competitive games.

I believe this is something that must be continued within the new NWSF Association

Finally I would just like to recognise just how good our local Association - originally Gladesville Hornsby Women's Football Association and then more recently, North West Sydney Women's Football- has been over 32 years of developing the youngest junior female football players through continuous and dedicated, innovative programs of training, development and match play.

That is a legacy that must be recognised and a momentum that must be continued as we move to the new amalgamation of North West Sydney Football.

In the July school holidays, a football clinic was held for junior girls U9 to U14. The girls participated in the three-day clinic, which was professionally led by NWSWF Technical Director – Gerry Gomez. Other coaching support was from senior players from the club and all participants learnt football techniques, while still having fun. We look forward to continuing this successful formula next year.

We will be working closely with the new association to support the talented girls at club level with an elite pathway. We will also be working with Spirit where we believe there is benefit for both Boys & Girls to improve football within the area of NWSF.
